

# WHAT WILL YOU DO AT LEADERSHIP CAMP?

**DAY 3** Participate in sessions and make your own transmission line from craft supplies. Travel to the top of Mt. Werner and attend a high-voltage safety demonstration.



**DAY 4** Raft the Colorado River. Show your best moves at the camp dance.

DAY 5 Learn about yourself in the leadership workshop. Enjoy a live raptor presentation by Hawk Quest. Play in the volleyball tournament and participate in the camp talent show!

DAY 6 Tour Craig Generation Plant. Enjoy the end-of-camp banquet.

DAY 7 Load the bus, say goodbye to your new friends, and return home.

Kay Electric Cooperative in Blackwell, Oklahoma, is once again sponsoring its **Annual Essay Contest** for all **High School Juniors**.

#### FOUR ALL-EXPENSE PAID TRIPS AND \$1,000 IN CASH PRIZES

- ⇒ Two contestants will win a trip to Washington, D.C., for the "Rural Electric Youth Tour", June 16-22, 2023.
- ⇒ Two contestants will win a trip to Steamboat Springs, CO, for the "Cooperative Youth Leadership Camp", July 14-20, 2023.
- $\Rightarrow$  Four cash prizes totaling \$1,000.

The top eight finalists on the written portion of the competition will interview with three judges on Tuesday, **February 28, 2023**. Following the oral competition, we will have a banquet for all contestants, their family and teachers in the Kay Room at the Kay Electric headquarters where we will name the winners of the all expense paid trips to the Rural Electric Youth Tour to Washington, D.C. and the Cooperative Youth Leadership Camp in Steamboat Springs, Colorado. The students winning 3rd and 4th place will win cash prizes.

If the student is chosen as one of the eight finalists, they <u>must accept</u> one of the eight awards, which will be determined by experienced judges. Entering the contest for the cash prize only is highly discouraged, as finalists do not know the outcome of their award until the evening of the banquet on **February 28, 2023**. **Once a student is chosen for one of the trips at the banquet, it is unacceptable to opt-out**. This would be unfair to other students who might have been able to attend the banquet and receive the award. The Washington, D.C. and Steamboat Springs winners will be required to participate in the trips. Both trips all expense paid trips are a chance of a lifetime! Please consider the requirements *before* entering the contest. **The deadline for all essays is Friday, January 13, 2023**. The essays must be delivered by mail or hand delivered to Kay Electric Cooperative by this date.

#### Assignment:

Contestants should submit a 500-600 word typed, creative essay on the above topic. On a separate cover sheet, include the following information: Your name and address, telephone number, parents' names, school, teacher's name and title of your essay. Also, include the title at the TOP OF PAGE ONE of your essay. DO NOT PUT YOUR NAME ON ANY PART OF THE ESSAY. ONLY ON THE COVER SHEET.

Include your formal resume with picture either on the essay or attached.

#### **Entry Deadline:**

Essays must be received in the Kay Electric Cooperative office no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, January 13, 2023.

#### How Written Essays Will Be Scored:

There are 100 points possible based on five areas:

1. Knowledge of subject

4. Composition

2. Originality

5. Grammar, Spelling and Neatness

3. Content (ability to adhere to topic)

#### **How Winners are Chosen:**

Each finalist's combined written score will be added to each of the three judges' scores for a final contest score. The winners will be announced the evening of **February 28, 2023** as Kay Electric's essay winners. There will be two trips awarded to Washington D.C. on the Cooperative Youth tour, two trips awarded to Steamboat Springs, Colorado on the Cooperative Youth Leadership Camp, and 4 cash prizes.

#### Do I Have To Be In an Organized High School Class to Enter?

No! You may enter this contest on your own by following the procedures on this sheet. There have been several independent entries (including home school students) over the years that have made the finals. Home school students are encouraged to enter the competition.

#### **ESSAY SCORING**

Written Essay (100 points possible)

Knowledge of subject:

30 points

Demonstrates a basic understanding of the Rural Electric program as it relates to the topic.

Originality

30 points

Essay shows thought.

Content (ability to adhere to topic)

20 points

Essay clearly elaborates on the topic chosen with facts to back up the writer's opinions.

Composition

10 points

Essay is composed in an organized format, flows well, and has good transitions.

**Grammar, Spelling and Neatness** 

10 points

Words, sentences, and paragraphs follow the standard rules of grammar; words are spelled correctly, and essay is typed or computer generated without messy corrections.

#### Oral Presentation (100 points possible)

Interview - Poise & Personality

40 points

Student is able to speak clearly, has eye contact and expression, and speaks with confidence.

Knowledge of Subject

30 points

Demonstrates a basic understanding of the Rural Electric program as it relates to the topic.

**Presentation of Self** 

30 points

Neat appearance, demonstrates a positive attitude and poise, seems excited to be a part of the contest, and exhibits a strong desire to be chosen as a delegate for the Rural Electric Youth Tour or Leadership Camp.
