

K-Up Foundation Honors Good Deeds of Kaw Lake Resident

Grant will build "Doc's Landing" emergency flight pad at Bear Creek Fire Department

he K-Up Foundation couldn't save the life of a beloved resident of the Kaw Lake area, but it will help the philanthropic legacy of Neil "Doc" Doctorman live on in his name. With a \$2,500 K-Up grant, plus donations from residents and materials donated by the Kay County Commissioner's office, the Bear Creek Rural Fire District will install a 30-foot by 30-foot helicopter landing pad and sidewalk for emergency medical transport services.

In honor of Doctorman, the pad will be named "Doc's Landing."

Sadly, Doctorman experienced a ride via medical helicopter on September 5, 2021, when Air Evac Lifeteam flew him to a Wichita hospital following a serious home accident. He died shortly afterward.

As witnessed by Fire Chief Lori Overton and other volunteeers responding to Doctorman's accident, the gravel surface made it difficult for EMS responders to push the gurney from the ambulance to the waiting helicopter. The experience prompted the department to take action at their next meeting. Soon efforts were underway to raise funds needed to create a concrete landing pad and sidewalk. While Doctorman was unable to benefit from the new landing pad, he would no doubt support the fire department's decision—and he would probably want to help. At fundraisers, school events, local festivals, and more, Doctorman could always be counted on to be there to show his support,

"He was a very viable volunteer in his community," Heffner said. "He would go out of his way to ensure you had what you needed for an event or whatever. He was always available to help."

In a small town, where needs are high, and tasks fall to the willing few, Doctorman's outgoing personality and selflessness will be missed, she added, but his namesake landing spot will serve as a reminder.

Heffner said the base of the pad is ready for concrete and gives special thanks to Kay County Commissioner Jack Godberson for his assistance. The department will hold a dedication ceremony after the concrete is poured and the sign is in place. 1321500

As Heffner pointed out, it will be a fine memorial to Doc Doctorman and many other unsung heroes who give their time to improving their rural communities.



Layered Lemon Pie

- 1 can (15 ³/₄ oz) lemon pie filling, divided
- 1 carton (8 oz) frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 graham cracker crust (9 inches)
